TWEET RECORD Julian Assange Extradition 2011-07-13 High Court Appeal Day 2 The Prosecution

For the Julian Assange Extradition Appeal, One Click has once again collated what we consider to be some of the best and most informative tweets coming out of the court on 13 July 2011. Not only is a quick flick through this record most informative, it will also form part of the website's documenting of this trial.

Discussed is the full panoply of this legal circus set to shred the lives of both the complainants and defendant, win or lose; the flawed law 9/11 kneejerk reaction and the baroque manoeuvrings of the CPS/Swedes prosecution barrister, Clare Montgomery, who reaches for the penis rather than the condom.




